



THE CASTLE WHICH TRAVELS WITH THE TRAVELLER


In the distance, Marialva announces its presence without much fuss. Among houses and streets, very quiet about their millennial past, someone greets us and we head towards the medieval castle. We see animals in stone, still waiting for their owners, and as in the past, we enter through the same gate of the old neighbourhood, protected by Archangel Michael. The walls, still intact, protect the village which time has forgotten, where the cobblestone streets still lead to doors and yards of centenary olive trees. At the centre, the people's power is still represented in a pillory square, symbolically veiled by the high Keep and under the watchful eyes of the Church of Santiago. From there, the view gradually becomes more reduced and we must imagine the abrupt river valleys. Whoever we may be, we will always be grateful for this visit, because from it we will keep the complexity of our history and the beauty of time standing still.

THREE WORLDS IN ONE ANCIENT VILLAGE.

It was this unique land inhabited by the Aravos, the Lusitanian people, later conquered by the Romans who built a city on it, where monumental remains have been preserved. It was later conquered by the Arabs, who remained there until 1063 when D. Fernando the Great, recovered it in his relentless reconquest of the Beirãs. The medieval castle and fortress located on the border, from before the Treaty of Alcanices (1297), has kept its medieval appearance practically intact. The dominant castle, at the top of a steep cliff, protects the oval-shaped walls which protected the old town, a vital monument of the urban complex, presiding over the vast landscape. It preserves three distinct nuclei: the "citadel", in ruins, within the walls; the "town", outside the walls, and the "Devesa", at the foot of the hill, and where the Roman city of Aravorum once stood.



Inside the walls there are still those who preserve the olive trees they inherited, thus guaranteeing olive oil for their daily lives.







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
