THE SECRET **OF THE AÇOR**

A hidden secret in the Serra do Acor, Piódão is a village perched in the landscape, stubborn against the inhospitable nature, showing an unexpected beauty in the countryside. The terraces are stairs on the slope, which shaped the mountain range, upon which the black schist houses settled, nestled snuggly against each other, with windows facing those who arrive. The blue of the doors and windows shine like humble lights on the schist, with a white church enlivening the memory of Christmases past, and patiently assembled nativity scenes. Next to a fountain, sitting on a schist bench or wetting your feet in the pure water of the stream, let yourself be enchanted by the beauty and history of the Historical Village of Piódão.


Main Parish Church



- 4 Threshing Floor



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






In a remarkable terraced landscape, these walls are an ancient

art used for forming agricultural land on which to sow cereals, helping to provide bread at home. Wisely, they were also a solution to secure and protect the steep slopes which protect Piódão. In the 13th century, there is reference to a Casal Piodam, later transferred to its current location, perhaps due to the installation of a Cistercian Monastery, whose remnants have disappeared, but to which the ancient invocation, so common in these abbeys, of Santa Maria (Main Parish Church) refers. It is said that one of the killers of Inês de Castro, Diogo Lopes Pacheco, settled here, surnames which still exist today in Piódão: the Lopes and the Pachecos. In the Numeramento Joanino (first national population census) of 1527, Piódão appears as "casall do piodam" with only two residents.
